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# Medicinal fund up by 5 times

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INCREASING POPULARITY of traditional medicines, thanks to people like Ramdev, has earned the government a new business venture — traditional Indian medicines.

The new zeal for the ministry has come from a five-fold increase in allocation for National Medicinal Plant Board (NMPB) in the 11th plan. The board has got Rs 950 crore for the plan period as compared to Rs 142 crore in the 10th plan.

Very soon the environment ministry will ask state forest departments to grow medicinal plants and conserve these plants in the forests in a bid to make them richer. "It will also boost the traditional Indian medicine industry, which has over 10,000 licensed pharmacies in India," a ministry official said.

According to the plan document, the money is to provide financial assistance to farmers to cultivate short rotation annuals and bi-annuals. But, there would also be funds for raising perenni-

als and trees through the Forest departments of the state governments. "The forest departments will have mainstream plants in their activities and develop innovative projects to avail the large Central funding in the 11th plan," a ministry note on medicinal plants said.

A senior ministry official said,

"The money earned can then be pumped back for forest and wildlife conservation."

The ministry has also urged the states to cut taxes on medicinal plants to boost its conservation. All these proposals would be discussed with state environment ministries next week.
